ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Picturesquely massed two-story clapboard house raised on brick foundation with two-tier pedimented portico and two-tier balustraded gallery on front facade south of projecting portico. Coupled Tuscan columns on the first level of the portico; coupled Ionic columns on paneled pedestals above. Projecting attic gables on side and rear facades, which also have hip-roofed dormers. Central section is also hip-roofed with brackets supporting extended eaves.

OUTBUILDINGS:

Two-bays-by-one bay vertical board cottage; gable roof with overhanging eaves.

LANDSCAPE FEATURES:

Rear yard enclosed by lattice fence.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

One of the few remaining residences on 22nd Avenue. After the turn of the century this was a very prestigious neighborhood, located directly north of the business district, and was known locally as Silk Stocking Row. During this period this was the home of Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Dabney. Dabney was a mayor of the city.
