18. Description

A 2½ story stone structure with irregular roof planes, steep gables, and tall chimneys. There are paired, multi-paned casement windows. The house is situated in a large expanse of lawn with a number of trees and shrubs. The site is on the lowland at the foot of bluffs overlooking the Ohio River.

19. History

Built in 1928 for Hugh M. Shwab, president of the Puritan Cordage Mills, the house was designed by W. Earl Gore, a Louisville architect. Gore practiced here independently for only a few years - 1924 to 1928 - and little is known about him or his work in Louisville.

20. Signifinance

The Shwab house is significant as an example of English Tudor Revival architecture as interpreted in a 1920s country house. It is one of several similar houses built in the first quarter of the 1900s in the affluent Upper River Road area outside the city. (See JF-544, JF-532, JF-541, JF-556, and the Glenview Historic District.)


