2 small attic eavelements  
E end; superior quality masonry  
on S front, very good on sides and  
rear; original porching simple shape.\*  
Owners have discovered foundation  
of another room off E end of house  
w large exterior chimney, probably  
separated from house.

The house was remodelled early  
20th C: windows elongated and  
lowered, plan changed to "hall -  
parlor"; massive Eastlake stairway  
installed, bullseye trimmed archway  
to new "parlor" (formerly 2 rooms), all  
woodwork changed; double end chimney  
tops removed & roofed over. Exterior  
remodelling was not completed. Present  
owners built a 2 room shed roofed  
wing on E end.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A on the S side of driveway on a line with the W yard fence, N 100 ft to B at fence corner, then E with fence 170 ft to C, then S 96 ft to D across the lane, then W with lane and driveway to the beginning containing the stone house, stone foundations and stone wall - about .4 acre
