**Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance**

The New Hotel Chase is located at 329 Cleveland Avenue in the city of Walker on the shore of Walker Bay, Leech Lake. It is a four story rectangular wood frame structure with clipped gable roof, built on a north-south axis. There are 7 irregularly spaced dormers along each side of the roof, also with clipped gable roofs. A single chimney penetrates the east roof slope. Fenestration consists of 9/9 double-hung sash irregularly arranged singly and in groups of two and threes. The original two-story, 24ft. porch extension on the north end of the hotel was widened on both the east and west sides in 1970-73, and now extends beyond both walls of the main rectangle. The original porte cochere on the south end has been removed and replaced by a two-story gable-roofed porch. The entire hotel exterior retains the original false half-timbering and stucco termed "Kelly stone" when built. The overall condition of the exterior is good to very good. The hotel interior contains a variety of partially remodeled and extensively altered spaces. The property includes a wood boat dock.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Built in 1922, the New Hotel Chase is significant as a representative of the first class resort hotel constructed in the cities of the cass county resort region with the advent of automobile transportation. With the exception of recent alterations to the orginal end exteriors, the hotel retains almost total exterior integrity. A local newspaper account published prior to the hotel's dedication states: "In planning the New Chase it was possible to secure a lake view from every room which makes it a distinctive tourist center and a feature rarely possible in hotel construction". The hotel was built by L.W. (Bert) Chase and his wife. They had owned hotels in Walker since 1898 and retained the Hotel Chase until 1946. The Chase continues today in its original function as a resort hotel.
