

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Republic Building is located in the central business district of Louisville. This structure is next to the Cathedral of the Assumption (National Register, 1977) and in the same block as the Galleria project. The building was originally slated for demolition by Oxford Properties, the Galleria developer. The Republic Building is also in the vicinity of the Seelback Hotel (National Register, 1975) and the Jefferson County Armory (National Register, 1980).

The Republic Building is located on the corner of Fifth and Muhammad Ali (Walnut St.). The largest facade faces Fifth Street which has seven bays. The Muhammad Ali facade has three bays. The building is eleven stories in height and sheathed in terra cotta and buff-colored, glazed brick. The first and second stories are unified by pilasters which terminates in cartouches. The cartouches are surrounded by green terra cotta. The ground floor bays have large shop windows and entries for commerical space. Large terra cotta panels emulate stone on the first through third floors. A string course of egg and dart mold articulates the second and third and third and fourth stories.

The fourth through ninth floors are sheathed in glazed brick. The fenestration of the upper stories consists of alternating double and triple groups of windows. The triple window groups are set in terra cotta surrounds and articulated by pilasters. Terra cotta panels of swags and garlands are under these clusters. Pilasters articulate the bays and are crowned by the cartouche motif. The upper two stories are composed of horizontally segmented layers of glazed brick and terra cotta. The pilasters are also topped by a cartouche. The structure is capped by a massive extended cornice adorned by brackets, modillions and dentils.

<sup>1</sup>The Louisville Galleria Project is a major retail/office development. Housing and Urban Development funds were involved which resulted in a federal review of the project during the period 1979-1980.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

1912 - 1916

The Republic Building is an outstanding example of early twentieth century commercial architecture in Louisville. The Renaissance decoration and extensive use of terra cotta are hallmarks of the early work of the prominent, local architectural firm of Joseph and Joseph.

Builder/Architect

The Republic Building was built as an office building with commerical space on the first floor. The structure was slated for demolition in the final phase of the Galleria. This phase has been dropped and the structure has been resold for renovation and continued use as an office building.

The Republic Building is the work of the local architectural firm of Joseph & Joseph. One of the principals, Alfred Joseph, Sr., began his architectural career with the office of McDonald & Dodd. The firm of Joseph & Joseph was founded in 1908 and their early works reflect the influence of McDonald and Dodd. The work of Joseph & Joseph in the first quarter of the twentieth century shows a pronounced tendency toward Mediterranean influence, especially that of the Spanish and Italian Renaissance. The use of terra cotta and glazed brick, a rich sense of color and textural contrast are all features of their work. These features are all clearly evident in the Republic Building. The structure is one of the major early works of the firm to survive. Other works of the firm include: the Rialto Theatre (destroyed), the YMHA (in the state of demolition), the Elks Club (National Register), the Breslin (Fincastle ) Building, the Willow Terrace and Dartmouth Apartments (National Register, Cherokee Triangle District) and the Commodore Apartments (National Register, pending).

The Republic Building is a fine example of the elegance, ornament and texture of the classical revival influence applied to a large-scale commercial building. It is one of a very few multi-story office buildings of the early twentieth century which remain in downtown Louisville.




