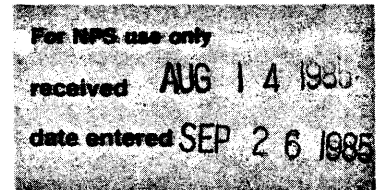

#1026 Taichert Warehouse, 623 12th, ill. 29.

4. Owner: Milton Taichert, 1036 7th, Las Vegas, N.M. (Same as # 1026.)

6. In Existing Survey: State Register #439.

7. Description: Sandstone foundation; purple/brown sandstone, rusticated ashlar (front), rubble/random ashlar (sides and rear); flat roof sloping to rear fronted by parapet wall; 1/1 double-hung windows with stone sills and lintels (2nd), small (hopper/casement?) windows with segmental arches (side), (fixed/casement?) windows with transom, stone lintel and arches (front); folding doors in moderate arched recess. Located immediately south of Taichert Building (#1024) with railroad and river to the west (rear), other warehouses to the south (side), and residences to the east (front).

8. Significance: The Taichert Warehouse Building was built in 1921 by Apolonio Sena. It is one of the last uses of the local sandstones--a handsome purple/brown on the front and a mixed, lighter palette on the side. Its simple facade symmetry focuses on the arched windows and slightly taller arched entry.

Sena first used the building for a garage/livery stable. He sold it to Dr. William House in 1933 who passed it, three years later, to the Taicherts. It was used as a warehouse for their wool, hide and fur business until they ceased operation in 1971. (See previous page.)
